Mexican Auto Insurance

If you are traveling into Mexico, you are required by law to have Mexican Automobile Insurance. It is possible that you are covered by your U.S. Policy (physical damage only, Liability is still required by Mexican Law). Because Puerto Penasco is 62 Miles across the U.S./Mexican Border, and is declared a "Free Zone" so a travel Visa is not required. Insurance can be purchased at gas stations and insurance agents in Gila Bend, Ajo, Why, or Lukeville.

Having an auto accident in Mexico can be a felony, rather than a misdemeanor. Whenever you are involved in an automobile accident in Mexico, you must immediately be able to prove financial responsibility in either of two ways: 1) Immediate Cash to cover all damages OR 2) An approved Mexican insurance policy. All Citizens driving in Mexico are subject to the laws of Mexico. Your U.S auto insurance liability policy, even if it bears a limited Mexican endorsement, is not recognized by Mexican authorities.

Passports

Make sure you and your traveling companions have valid IDs. To reenter the United States, you will need to present a valid passport, passport card or enhanced driver's license. All children under 16 (even infants) are required to have a passport. Be sure to plan ahead. New passports can be obtained from your US Post office. Fill out the application on line ([http:// www.USPassportNow.com](http://www.USPassportNow.com)). Bring the printed application, proof of US citizenship (original birth certificate, expired passport, or a certificate of citizenship/naturalization), 2 passport sized photos, and a valid photo ID. Allow 6-8 weeks for delivery. For children under 16 years old, parents must be present when submitting the application.

Items not allowed into Mexico

U.S. citizens are warned against taking any type of firearm or ammunition into Mexico without prior written authorization from the Mexican authorities. Entering Mexico with a firearm, some kinds of knives or even a single round of ammunition is illegal, even if the weapon or ammunition is taken into Mexico unintentionally. The Mexican government strictly enforces its laws restricting the entry of firearms and ammunition. Violations have resulted in arrests, convictions, and long prison sentences for U.S. citizens

Restrictions on items brought back from Mexico into the U.S.

All travelers entering the United States are required to DECLARE any meats, fruits, vegetables, plants, seeds, or animals. Most fruits, vegetables, and plants may not be brought into the United States without advance permission. Fresh, dried, or canned meats and meat byproducts are prohibited entry into the United States from most foreign countries.

Directions to Puerto Peñasco

Phoenix

1. Take the I-10 West to the end of town (Buckeye Area)
2. Take Hwy.85 South to Gila Bend (same exit as I-8 to San Diego)
3. At the end of Gila Bend you will see a McDonald's, right before the Mc Donald's turn on to the continuation of Hwy.85 South (90 more minutes until the border).
4. Follow Hwy.85 straight through into Mexico. You will have 2 turns to make into the town of Sonoyta. Just follow the signs overhead that point to Pto. Peñasco (that is Puerto Peñasco abbreviated). From Sonoyta it's roughly 60 more miles

Phoenix South East Valley

1. Take I-10 East to Maricopa Rd. If you miss it Queen Creek Rd Hwy.347 will do (they end up the same road.) Head South on Maricopa (347).
2. Travel about 10 Miles & look for Hwy. 238 West. (Mile Post 175).
3. Travel West on Hwy. 238 for about an hour until you get to Hwy. 85 outside of Gila Bend. Turn left heading West into Gila Bend.
4. At the end of Gila Bend you will see a Mc Donald's, right before the Mc Donald's turn on to the continuation of Hwy.85 South (90 more minutes until the border).
5. Follow Hwy.85 straight through into Mexico. You will have 2 turns to make into the town of Sonoyta. Just follow the signs overhead that point to Pto. Peñasco (that is Puerto Peñasco abbreviated). From Sonoyta it's roughly 60 more miles

Tucson

1. Take the I-10 to I-19 South. You will only be on I-19 for about a mile, then exit onto Ajo highway (also known as Hwy.86).
2. Take Hwy.86 West for about 2&1/2 hours until you get to Why
3. At Why take a left, heading South on Hwy.85 to the border (30 more miles)
4. Follow Hwy.85 straight through into Mexico. You will have 2 turns to make into the town of Sonoyta. Just follow the signs overhead that point to Pto. Peñasco (that is Puerto Peñasco abbreviated). From Sonoyta it's roughly 60 more miles

Tucson NORTH

1. Take the I-10 West to I-8 (a little before Casa Grand).
2. Take I-8 West to Gila Bend, take the 2nd exit and turn Left on Hwy. 85 South. (or right for Gila Bend)
3. Follow Hwy.85 straight through into Mexico. 90 more minutes.
4. You will have 2 turns to make into the town of Sonoyta. Just follow the signs overhead that point to Pto. Peñasco (that is Puerto Peñasco abbreviated). From Sonoyta it's roughly 60 more miles

San Diego (Southern California / Yuma)

1. Take I-8 to Gila Bend.
2. After entering Gila Bend and take a left after the McDonalds on Hwy. 85
3. Follow Hwy.85 straight through into Mexico. 90 more minutes.
4. You will have 2 turns to make into the town of Sonoyta. Just follow the signs overhead that point to Pto. Peñasco (that is Puerto Peñasco abbreviated). From Sonoyta it's roughly 60 more miles.

Directions Playa Bonita Hotel & RV Park/Laos Mar Hotel

Playa Bonita is located on Sandy Beach. As you end your drive from the border, turn right at the second street light. That street is called Calle 26 or Street 26 or No Reeleccion. Follow that street straight about 0.5 miles until you pass over the railroad tracks. Shortly after, you will arrive at a round-about section. You will drive along the golf course until you see Playa Bonita and Laos Mar on the horizon. After the round-about, it will be your first option to turn left as you look out into the ocean during the drive. After you turn left, here is a big entrance for Playa Bonita and Laos Mar.
